A. Assessment Criteria

Criteria	Score

B. Mark Reduction

Each team member shall **refrain from disclosing the name of his or her institution**. Disclosure may subject the mooters concerned to a **deduction mark of 5 points** from their individual score, which will in turn affect the team's overall score for General Round. The judge who identifies the violation should mark on the score sheets. The Chief Judge will play a facilitating role to align on decision within the panel of judges in the courtroom to validate the mark deduction.
